Formed in 1898, the Minnesota State Band is the official band of the State of Minnesota. It is the only remaining state band in the United States. The Minnesota State Band is funded in part by the Minnesota Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund--state monies designated to be spent only on arts preserving Minnesota history. A non-profit organization, the band has all-volunteer membership. Between now and the end of the summer, the band performs in 10 concerts.
